### **Year 11 Remote Learning**

Dear Parent/Carer,

As you are aware, following advice from the London Coronavirus Response Cell, we had to send the Year 11 'bubble' home to self isolate due to a confirmed case of COVID-19. While pupils are self isolating it is important that they are able to access their education remotely. From Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> December until the end of term on Friday 18<sup>th</sup> December, we will be providing remote lessons for our year 11 cohort.

Sadly this does mean that we have had to postpone our Year 11 Sixth Form Taster Day scheduled for Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> December. We will reschedule this in the New Year. The normal timetable will resume on Thursday for remote learning.

As was the case during the previous school closure, all lessons will be posted via a link on your son's Google classroom page. Pupils will be able to access the remote lesson provided by our staff here at school. Pupils will need to follow their normal school timetable, however we have adjusted the time slightly to provide time for our teachers to move from their normal lesson to the remote lessons and set themselves up. The adjusted times are as below

4A	12:30 - 1:15
Lunch	1:15 - 2pm
5	2:15-3pm

Pupils should be ready to log onto their remote lesson at the times stated for each period. As with normal procedure, our teachers will register the pupils as they log on to ensure that all pupils are accessing the learning. If you have any concerns over access to the remote learning you should contact the school directly and we can try to support you. For the independent work that is being set teachers will be chasing up that this work has been completed.

Pupils may be required to complete worksheets as part of the lesson which they can do via google classroom.

We understand that this is not an ideal situation and may present some challenges, however, we will do our very best to ensure that you son is given the best opportunity to continue with their learning and not allow this situation to disrupt their progress.
