Dear Families,

As we are reaching the end of term, I am now able to give you some preliminary details of how our students will return to school in September 2020. I will share more detailed plans with you before the official end of term next week. Our model is based on DfE guidance and a set of principles shared with all Lambeth schools.

A gradual return – the first week

To ensure an orderly start to the year, after what will be almost six months of remote learning for many of our students, we will be phasing in each year group over the first week back. This will allow us to explain clearly to all students the changes that they will see around school and the expectations that we have for the new term. I do hope that you can see that this approach will be beneficial in establishing new routines to keep all our students, staff and families as safe as possible. This is what we are planning:

We will be holding two virtual information sessions for parents on Wednesday 15th July (Years 7, 8 and 9) and Thursday 16th July (Year 10, 11, 12 13). Both evenings will start at 5:00pm. These will be based on year groups, so you will need to attend the year groups for all your children as the information will be slightly different for each of them.

Food and drink

When we initially return in September, we may not be able to offer full hot food or drink facilities, but we hope to be able to offer 'grab and go' food such as sandwiches, snacks and cold drinks. Wherever possible, I would ask that your child brings in a packed lunch and a bottle of water/juice (no high-energy drinks) as this will enable us to reduce movement around the school.

Punctuality and Attendance

The small nature of the school site has presented significant challenges when attempting to maintain year group bubbles and prevent large gatherings of students. As a result we will be making small alterations to the start and ending of the school day for each of our year groups. This is illustrated in the tables below:

All students **must** be onsite by the times outlined above, or the school may not allow students onto the school site. As I am sure you can appreciate, we are trying to keep groups separated and although this may seem somewhat draconian, we have made this decision with the health, safety and wellbeing of all students at the forefront of our minds.

The leadership team are meeting daily as we continue to develop our plans based on the current government guidance for schools. We will continue to share information with you as our plan progresses but, as with all our planning, this is subject to change if government guidance changes.
