Citizenship GCSE education aims to engage pupils in the local and global world; to consider their role as global citizens and to think critically but proactively about a politicised environment. The course encourages students to play an active part in public and democratic life as informed and active citizens. The Citizenship Studies GCSE allows for students to undertake a personal citizenship action project and for students to develop the ability to analyse and comment on all key themes.
