

Destinations Analysis

Sixth Form:

There were 76 students who finished their education in the 6th form last academic year. 59 students were part of our Elite Football Academy, with aspirations to progressing on to play at some level within the game

University

43% of our students have moved on to university/further education. Three students progressed on to Russell Group Universities, namely, Birmingham, Nottingham and Sheffield. Three students attended University in the USA having gained scholarships in Football, through our link with Player Path.

Employment

23% of our students went into employment. In this group 6 students went into jobs in the sports industry. 3 of these students are playing professional football, whilst the other 3 have taken up positions in sports coaching. Another 3 students are working part time, taking a gap year before attending University next academic year.

Apprenticeships and Training

16% of our students progressed on to an Apprenticeship or Traineeship. Four students have started a traineeship with Crystal Palace FC. This is through our Football Academy partners, Volenti Academy. Two students have gone into sports coaching apprenticeships. Remaining students have gone into trade apprenticeships including, finance and lift engineering.

Gap Year

6% of our students are currently taking gap years, therefore, not in education or employment. We are looking into those students coming in to LNS to have one to one careers interviews with Chris Jarvis.

No Contact

12% of the students/parents were uncontactable. Of these students, Four of these were A Level students and the remainder were students who studied vocational courses.

Year 11:

There were 77 students that left London Nautical at the end of Year 11. These students would normally progress on to either 6th form, college, apprenticeships or employment.

Colleges

72% of the 77 students left to find colleges or 6th forms away from LNS, choosing to continue their studies elsewhere. Of this group, 35 students attend a college with the remainder attending 6th Forms. Interestingly, 3 students left to attend other Football/Education pathways with other providers.

Employment

Two students have moved into employment. One of those students was unable to attend school much in Yr11 due to his physical/mental health.

Apprenticeships and Training

Two students were able to gain full time scholarships in football at Huddersfield Town and Shrewsbury Town respectively. One student has also gained an Electrical Apprenticeship.

Gap Year

One student has reported that he is currently sourcing Apprenticeships. Therefore not in education or employment.
