The new school library catalogue was launched in September. Looking for fiction and non-fiction titles is more straightforward than it used to be, due to the colourful, eye-catching, user-friendly interface. The number of students who are choosing to make independent book searches has noticeably increased!

The on-screen format is menu-based, which allows for searching by word, title, subject, author, series and genre. Students are also able to obtain additional book titles by selecting options for books which have a similar plot to the ones that they are interested in and they can also look for other books that are written by their favourite authors via the "More by this Author" option.

A "rolling carousel" of new books, popular book titles and recent returns is also on the menu and is regularly updated.



The six shortlisted books, along with a brief description of what they are about, are as follows:

















1. Beetles for Breakfast

Looks at the science and construction behind well-known buildings and landmarks.

5. If the World Were 100 People

Focuses on citizens around the world. Reminds the reader that we all come in different shapes, sizes, colours and abilities.

6. Microbe Wars

An introduction to the world of the microscopic, bacteria and viruses.





New graphic novels, biographies and books about topical subjects such as climate change are on the library shelves ready to be taken away – A good read guaranteed!!






