LNS was chosen by organisers at the Royal Society to take part in their annual competition. The Young People's Book Prize aims to promote literacy in young people



and to inspire them to read about science. It also supports the writing of excellent, accessible STEM books for under-14s. Six books are on this year's shortlist. Members of our judging panel couldn't wait

to get their hands on the books when they arrived!



The shortlist is put together by an adult judging panel, which is made up of writers (e.g. award-winning author Sharna Jackson), broadcasters, teachers and scientists.

Young judges from schools across the country are invited to scrutinise and read the books – our core judging panel have been reading the books at school during lunchtime and at home. They will then be



asked to decide on the winning book.







The Shortlist

Very much looking forward to hearing all the Bookbuzz book chat when the year 7s return to school in January.






















Did you know?...
